## Reflective Questions Tool

### Work With Us, Not On Us

- Am I designing with people, especially those affected by change, not just for them?
- How am I listening to and including different viewpoints in the process?

### Don't Work Alone

- Who else in the system, including communities should be involved in this work?
- How can we learn and grow together through collaboration?

### Focus on Real-Life Experiences of Inequality

- Am I starting with real experiences of inequality, not treating them as an add-on?
- How do these experiences shape our design and decision-making?

### Create a Fair Exchange for Citizen Contribution

- Have I asked people how they want to be involved?
- Am I valuing their time, ideas, and contributions fairly?

### Design With Power in Mind

- Who holds power in this situation and how is it being used?
- What can I do to share power more fairly through design?

### Make Space

- Am I creating space for people to think, connect, and explore together?
- How can I support learning and experimentation without pressure?

### Remember We're All Human

- Am I designing with empathy, recognising the full range of human emotions?
- How do I make space for both joy and pain in this work?

## **Keep It Real and Relevant**

- Is this work grounded in real-life experiences and community action?
- How can I stay connected to what's actually happening on the ground?

## **Do Bitesize**

- Is this design flexible, accessible, and easy to engage with?
- How can I break things down into manageable, meaningful parts?

## **Do Target**

- Am I avoiding one-size-fits-all solutions?
- How can I tailor our approach to meet specific needs and make real change?

## **Design Without Fixed Endings**

- Am I focusing on enabling and supporting, not just finishing?
- How can I build something that evolves over time?

## **Describe Development in Different Ways**

- Am I open to different ways of talking about growth and progress?
- How can I make space for multiple narratives and definitions?
