Fairer Health for All is Greater Manchester's response to recommendations in Sir Michael Marmot's Build Back Fairer report and the GM Independent Inequalities Commission.

It outlines our approach to tackling the root causes of ill health and inequalities, and ensuring people have the best possible health and wellbeing, no matter who they are or where they live.

Co-created with partners across the system including the Voluntary, Community, Faith and Social Enterprise sector - the Fairer Health for All Framework outlines key principles, alongside tools and resources for how we can collaborate, share, and learn, and monitor progress through system wide outcome and assurance targets and metrics.

Fairer Health for All Fellowship Programme

The Fellowship programme enables cross-sectoral learners from a non-public health background to develop their knowledge and skills in public health. **Cohort 1 (Feb 2024 for 12 months) welcomed 16 Fellows from across GM** (1 day per week). The fellows have protected time for CPD and are supported by a mentor to implement a change project based around the themes of equity, sustainability and inclusion. **Cohort 2 will be launched in summer 2024.**

Alexandra Guy Strategic Partnerships Lead, Housing, GM	Investigating the extent to which the VCSE and housing infrastructures in GM are equipped to achieve health equity, particularly in the context of a cost-of-living crisis.
