



Outcomes

<u>Screening uptake at Ordsall Health Surgery – data used from GM Cancer</u> **Dashboard 1 month post-screening period** 64.90% 48.20% **GREATER** MANCHESTER **GM FEDS** TRAINING HUB





14th September-4th October 2024 (735 patients eligible)
